The tower crane is up!

This past August, a tower crane was erected high above the Union Station train shed roof, over the train platforms and tracks. This massive crane was installed in sections over a single weekend and marks a significant milestone in the restoration of the historic train shed.

The crane will be used for the installation of the steel and glass atrium portion of the new roof and allows for faster, more efficient construction, with less disruption to you - our passengers - and GO service.

The crane will be onsite for the entire duration of the atrium construction, which is expected to be completed by the end of 2014.

Find GO schedule information easier!

The new printed schedules will be easier to understand through a helpful 'how-to read' section, clearer route maps, simpler route identification and a larger font size.

Online schedules will also undergo significant changes in the overall design, while making it easier to read and access the information you need.

At train stations and bus terminals, redesigned schedule signs, maps and station notices will make accessing information at these locations quicker and easier.

Several GO Bus route names will be changing and route numbers will be added to trips that currently don't have one. These changes will help make getting the schedule and route information you need easier.

GO's Transit Safety is 15 stronger

Fifteen new Transit Safety Officers were sworn in as special constables on October 3 at Union Station. In front of family, friends and veteran officers, GO Transit's newest recruits swore under oath to preserve the peace and prevent offences to the best of their abilities.

Trainees undergo a rigorous 16 weeks of training in safety, enforcement and customer service before becoming Transit Safety Officers. Transit Safety Officers are appointed as special constables by the Commissioner of the Ontario Provincial Police in order to obtain limited police officer powers as defined by the OPP. Transit Safety Officers are held to a high level of professionalism and accountability through the conditions of their appointment and a strict code of conduct.

Just last month, probationary Transit Safety Officers Michael Walton and Anthony Lafrate assisted a distraught customer in tracking down her purse, which was lost on the GO system. These officers went above and beyond to put the customer first. "We are supposed to put ourselves in the customer's shoes," commented TSO Walton, "The goal is to get the customer home safe."

This is just another example of how we're taking your safety seriously.

The Pickering bridge opens soon

Earlier this year, GO Transit began construction on a 250-metre, fully enclosed pedestrian bridge to connect the Pickering GO Station and an office tower currently being built on the north side of Highway 401.

Once complete, the bridge will provide the residents of Pickering and GO commuters with a safe and convenient way of crossing the highway. GO passengers will also have easy access to an additional 500 parking spaces which will be available adjacent to the new office tower.

Some additional touches still need to be made to the bridge, including encasing it in exterior glass, before it is open to the public in November of this year.

During the final phase of the project, in spring 2012, the bridge will be wrapped in a metal shroud, which is a light and durable shell.

In addition to other recent upgrades at the station, including a new station building and redesigned bus loop, the pedestrian bridge will help make Pickering GO Station a modern and commuter-friendly link between multiple modes of transportation.
